BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Wednesday, April 5, 2017 at 5:30

Present: Britt Metivier, Bethany LaHaye, Val Raney, Tiffany, Michelle, Deb Richardson, Liz Frederick, Meggan Wehmeyer, Heather White

Agenda:

1) Approval of Minutes - approved

2) Treasurer's Report

- checking = \$28,654; savings = \$38,103

- expenses from past month included: \$1,550 bonus from STARS program; 2 payrolls, rent, telephone, advertising, paid for QuickBooks, Val purchased Dyson vacuums

- Val plans to buy rugs and blinds/shades in future. Blinds should have no strings hanging. Specially made?

- Net income currently \$33,000

- Val made up a draft budget for next year - to be discussed in detail at an executive session

- Val researched some possible benefits for staff:

Retirement plans - simple IRA; coop matches up to 3% of salary. ~\$2,700. Health benefits - since we're a small business, these would be purchased via Vermont Healthcare; Val to find a Navigator to talk to staff to gauge interest,

estimate cost; enrollment is in the fall. She's been in touch with the Rockwood Agency.

Employee Assistance Program from Invest EAP - mental health support, legal help, etc.; 3-5 phone calls for counseling. Would include board members. Fixed price for small business - \$750 for a year.

Dental - \$54.50 per month. Per Meggan, not a good deal unless a lot of work needs to be done.

Short-term disability?

Life insurance?

Insurance agent to come talk to us?

Memberships in NAEYC/VAEYC, VCCICC (local professional organizations for staff)?

3) Admissions Report -

- enrollment at 46; still too many students requesting AM class. Teachers are working on asking parents of older students if they're willing to do the PM class.

- Discussed Tiffany's daughter enrolling next year. The Board agrees that decisions regarding which classroom she'll be in can be left up to Tiffany. Boundaries will be important if she's in Tiffany's class.

- Tiffany would like to have a mix of 3- and 4-year olds in each class if possible - seems to work well for classroom dynamics.

- 1 new student has started school this past week.

4) Director's Report

- Lebanon Opera House trip - all set with parents (3) staying with afternoon students through lunch.

- look into bus for field trips, including upcoming LOH trip? Val will discuss with Harriet.

- Family satisfaction surveys: not many are done, we're hoping to get more of a response.

- Thank you Tiffany for using personal carpet cleaner.

- A reminder that there's no school Thursday, May 4th

- May 31st - trout release; rain or shine

- More goat farm field trips planned for this spring.

- Discussed August Open House(s?) - tentatively Wednesday the 23rd and Thursday the 24th; 2 separate open houses - one for AM classes and one for PM classes.

(Update: Use of the room downstairs on these dates has been scheduled with the Recreation Department)

5) Fundraising-Fun Run

- John okayed the use of the Rec Center grill; John has put Fun Run info in the Rec Center flyer.

- Val will talk to BG's about meat - went fast last year.

- Potluck - suggested donation: \$1?; good signage letting people know that the money is going to the Food Shelf

- Use Signup genius or blog to have parents sign up to bring certain items: salads; bags of chips; desserts; fruit salad

- Buy disposable trays to give to parents

- The Board voted to not do Original Works again next year. Our fundraisers will be the Bake Sale and the Fun Run next year.

6) Operations

- Some parents still have only 0-5 points. Co-presidents will send these parents an email stressing the importance of participation in the school; should points be discussed with specific parents at parent-teacher conferences?

- Discussed consequence if not enough points

- no fine - parents will tend to just pay the fine and not worry about actual participation

- to put in handbook - not allowed to come back if points not met? Should anything be done half-way through the year if parents don't have any points?

- to be further discussed at May's meeting.
