ECERS IMPROVEMENT PLAN

One area we received low scores on our ECERS assessment was in the way we serve snack. Snacks should be served with utensils instead of with hands. Our improvement plan states that we will begin doing this. We ask families to help us with this by bringing serving utensils. We also have disposable gloves available. Thanks for helping us to follow through on this improvement.

STARS RENEWAL

After our ECERS improvement plan was submitted and accepted our STARS 3-year renewal was complete and we received our certificate for continuation at the 4 star level at the end of last week. For the next two years we'll have to submit annual reports which involve considerably less work!

NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOMS

New VELS standards were adopted in the fall of 2015 so you may notice that references to VELS have slightly different terminology. The morning class began Show and Tell this month. The children did an outstanding job of practicing speaking and listening skills (VELS: Communication & Expression – Language Development). Both classes participated in some projects to prepare for Valentine's Day, including decorating Valentine mail bags, creating and writing on Valentine cards for parents and secret Valentines – afternoon class (VELS: Communication

& Expression – Literacy Development, Creative Arts & Expression). We've been very impressed at the growing ability of the children to write – depending on developmental level that means making controlled intentional marks, tracing dotted letters, writing the first or more letters of one's name, copying letters or words, knowing how to write some familiar words from memory or using invented spelling to write words. Both classes enjoyed the trip to Lebanon Opera House to see the musical theater performance of *The Monster Who Ate My Peas*. The afternoon class was very attentive on their tour of the Hartland Post Office (VELS: Social Studies – Economics). Drummers from Hartland Elementary School gave the afternoon class an impressive performance! It was great to see the children choose to play musical instruments immediately upon returning to the classroom that day (VELS: Creative Arts & Expression – Music). Our extended outside time on Fridays for the morning class and Outside Fridays for the afternoon class continue to be engaging. The children have had a lot of fun on the sliding hill we discovered in January behind the library. There have been lots of chances to practice problem solving, exploration and initiative skills as well as engage in various movement activities. The afternoon class continues to discover new areas to explore on their Outside Friday adventures!

After the winter break we'll be discussing dental health. The morning class has initiated a dramatic play experience of making a classroom "airplane" and traveling by air. We'll follow their lead with some transportation activities. Plans for the afternoon class include continuation with writing lower case letters in the Fundations program and a study of several common fairy tales.. We'll prepare for St. Patrick's Day and spring with some planting activities. During the long month of March, we'll schedule a pajama day and a beach day. We'll explore maple sugaring when we tap the big maple tree adjacent to the playground and if weather is favorable plan a sugarhouse visit for the morning class.
