GENTLE REMINDER

We've been asked to remind families that it states in our parent handbook that younger siblings should not accompany family aides on classroom aiding days. These days are meant to be a special time for your preschooler and you and there are safety and distraction issues when younger siblings are present.

SNOW/ICE DAY SCHOOL CLOSINGS & DELAYS

Our school closes for snow days whenever Hartland Elementary School closes. Information about school closings can be heard on local radio stations by 6:30 a.m. Some examples are XL 92 and KIXX 100.5. Hartland Elementary School records a message on its phone after 6:30 a.m. (436-2255); you can also get a link to Hartland Elementary School from the HCNS website (www.hcnsvt.org). If Hartland Elementary School has a delayed opening HCNS will delay the start of classes to 9:00 a.m. If school at HES is cancelled on the day of a HCNS board meeting, the board meeting will also be cancelled or postponed.

HARTLAND CHRISTMAS PROJECT

HCNS will be participating in the Hartland Christmas Project again this year. This project, which has been around for over 30 years is sponsored by local churches, schools, businesses and individuals working together to assist Hartland families in need during the holidays. Families submit a list of needs and wants to organizers; then those who are able purchase the items on the list. Our school will be assisting some families. We hope to have paper ornaments placed on our classroom walls so that families can pick them up before the Thanksgiving break. HCNS families may take ornaments; purchase the gifts listed on the ornaments and then bring all gifts to HCNS unwrapped, with the paper ornaments securely attached. We plan to have the children help with gift wrapping. Gifts listed on the ornaments should be new. Other ways to help include donating used winter clothing in good condition (no shoes or underwear please) and gently used household goods, toys and games. Used car seats cannot be accepted. Personal care items and nonperishable food items will also be collected. Food items especially needed include canned meats, spaghetti sauce with meat in it, peanut butter, canned vegetables and fruits, powdered milk, instant and brewing coffee, hot chocolate, and hot cereals such as oatmeal or cream of wheat. Personal care items requested include bar soap, shampoo, deodorant, tooth

paste and brushes. Laundry soap, dish detergent, toilet paper and paper towels are also gratefully accepted. We hope that each child can bring in one food or personal care item – there is always a great need for these items. We will have boxes in each classroom to collect food, used clothing and household goods, and personal care items not on the family wish lists. We are planning to deliver our school's donations to the Hartland Brick Church with the children in the afternoon class. We feel that participating in the Christmas Project is a meaningful way for children to take the perspective of others and to begin to realize that giving to others is a part of the true spirit of the season. All gifts and donations must be brought to HCNS by Tuesday December 15th. We'll deliver them to the church on Wednesday December 16th

SCHOOL AT MRS. HARRIET'S HOUSE

School for both the morning and afternoon classes will be held at Mrs. Harriet's house on <u>**Thursday December 10th**</u> (Snow Date: Tuesday December 15th). We will make and eat holiday goodies, and have some outside time (sledding if weather permits). Drop off and pick up will be at the usual times and <u>at Mrs. Harriet's</u> house on this day. Directions will be provided as the date get closer.

HOLIDAY PARTIES

Holiday parties will be held on <u>Thursday December 17th at 10:30a.m. for the morning class</u> and <u>at 3:00 p.m. for the afternoon class</u> (Snow Date: Friday December 18th at the same times). Parents and siblings are invited to join us for holiday gift unwrapping, songs, games and finger plays. We will post wish lists (before the Thanksgiving break) for supplies, materials and other items needed for the classrooms. **We ask that each child bring in a present for the school.** The present should be wrapped and have your child's name on it. Please talk to your child about how the present is for everyone at the school. During the holiday parties the children will unwrap the presents they have brought in. <u>We strongly request that you do not bring gifts for</u> <u>the teachers!</u> Instead we'd appreciate your participation in the Hartland Christmas Project and gift giving to the classrooms.

We'll finish up before the Thanksgiving holiday break with preparations for the harvest and stone soup celebrations. When we return we will spend the three weeks before the December holiday break learning about hibernation and different holiday celebrations, going to the Hopkins Center theater performance and reflecting on it or on the story read in class, making holiday gifts for families and participating in the Hartland Christmas Project.

We expect that we'll have a visit from a STARS ECERS assessor sometime before the December holiday break. We are trying to be especially proactive about handwashing and other sanitary practices before this visit since they really look closely at this. Thank you in advance for your help reinforcing this on aiding days. Things to concentrate on: following the proper handwashing procedures (on posters near the classroom sinks), washing hands for the suggested 10 - 15 seconds time and with **warm** water, washing hands **after** as well as before snack; following standard procedure for table washing and sanitizing and sink sanitizing. If you are unsure about your role please ask us.
