NORTHEAST ORGANIC FARMING ASSOCIATION (NOFA) PARTNERSHIP

We were invited by the local NOFS representative, Sharon Irwin, to participate in a partnership with a local farm. The partnership involves writing letters back and forth with the farmer and taking a field trip or trips to the farm. We already had a connection with Sherry Clarke who raises Dwarf Nigerian goats at her Bly Acres mini-farm. The morning class has been corresponding with Sherry by mail. Both classes have participated in walking field trips to the farm. We plan to visit more times before the end of the school year. It is "kidding season" on the farm. The morning class was able to observe and pet the first babies of the year (1 week old) during their visit last week. Sherry encourages families to visit the farm at other times as well.

NEWS FROM THE CLASSROOMS

At the beginning of March, we tapped the big maple tree adjacent to the playground. The children have enjoyed tasting the sap on the spouts and checking daily to see if there is sap in the buckets. The morning class will visit Withington's sugarhouse this week. The afternoon class has been creating weekly journal pages (drawing and writing); they have also been working on name writing using lower case letters. We have seen lots of growth in both activities! The morning class has grown in many ways, most notably in social interactions; we see many examples every day of sharing, caring and friendship development. Both classes celebrated the arrival of spring by making and eating pancakes with maple syrup. The children are looking forward to beach day (afternoon class) and pajama day (both classes) that will happen before the end of March. Signs of spring are appearing everywhere such as abandoning snow pants and sometimes jackets, the departure of snow, ice and mud, the return of more bird sounds and sightings and renewed sandbox play. The children have been making weekly observations during our Friday excursions. On our last Outside Friday outing the children helped locate trash along the walking path that the adults picked up – several grocery bags full. During this Easter week we are finding lots of way to use plastic eggs – painting projects, parachute popcorn, alphabet matching, magnetic exploration, and movement activities.
