Caregiver Feedback

- Greta Marchese interested in being on the board
- Having pizza at board meetings might encourage more parents to come to board meetings Board decided to rotate bringing pizza - Val will bring for June meeting
- Would it be easier to have board meetings downstairs (at full-sized tables)? Might be conflicts with other events. To be discussed further in the future.

Approve March Minutes - approved

Treasurer's Report

- Checking = \$7,868.62, savings = \$19,122.51, investment account (original was \$50,000) = 49,388.67
- Currently at a loss of \$3,000, but payments from school districts still due
- Bus company for 4C transport First Student: \$300-400 a week
- Heather will talk to Hartland ES bus driver
- Possible to have Hartland "employ" someone to drive 10-passenger vans owned by Rec Center? (Val will look into)

• Shuttle services?

Admissions Report

- Adjustments to website, including took off participation record
 - o consolidated forms
- 38 enrolled (3 classrooms? 2 morning, 1 afternoon); Val will look into numbers for having 4 classes with only 38 students
- Val gave paperwork to 4C's overlapping students
- Paperwork is coming in

Director's Report

- Trip to Lebanon Opera House went well
- Teachers will meet with district kindergarten teachers
- Fun Run Harriet and Tiffany won't be here at conference
- Tie-dying of Fun Run shirts went well
- Storage space in rec center should work Harriet will take care of this this summer; will look into storage shed downstairs
- End of the year activities includes trip to Hartland Elementary School outdoor classroom and Paradise Park (where Windsor has their Forest Friday).
- AM class going to Cobb Hill on 31st
- Last day of school is Thursday, June 7th

Operations Report

- $\sim 1/3$ of families have gone above and beyond participation requirements
- Some families had a hard time completing requirements
- Binders work well some benefits to online tracking, but not worth the logistical mess

Fun Run

- Heather and Val to get hot dogs and condiments
- Harriet will resend SignUp Genius link
- Girl Scouts will man the grill and help serve they'll be there at 11:00

Hiring Committee

- we need to post on Schoolspring Val, Nikki, and Harriet will post general postings (with an emphasis on a Special Ed endorsement)
- Harriet to have AM class only, with lower number of enrollments and her move toward retirement
- FT head teacher hire AM & PM classes
- Bonnie AM w Harriet, PM with New Hire
- Assistant Hire AM aide
- Discussed the possibility of having just a teacher, no teacher's aide max is 10 students and it would be really challenging for the head teacher
- A hire as "floating aide"?
- Final decision for enrollment with 3 classroom model: Can accept 7 more students 15 students for 3 classrooms; 45 cap
- Katelyn interested in joining committee

Survey Results

- Pick-up & drop-off will remain the same. Some good suggestions, but not practical (teachers need a lunch between classes to prepare for afternoon classes)
 - O Some parents said the afternoon pick-up time conflicted with their older kids' bus drop-off.
 - We'll let parents know that buses can drop off at Rec Center
- Aiding: some parents unhappy with requirement
 - Stress aiding responsibility at Open Houses it's an integral part of the school and there are other preschools in the area without the requirement that might be a better fit
- Aiding schedule
 - Some parents said it would be easier to sign up online
 - The board decided to keep the paper calendar. Teachers are fine with parents emailing them to check on schedule (can email photo of paper calendar and sign up for them)
 - Some caregivers were disappointed that the aiding calendar was full we can let caregivers know that having 2 aides is always an option
 - Open House tell them to come with available dates to aide
- Facebook 7 spots left, let people know that they don't have to live in Hartland
 - "Serving Hartland and Beyond"
- Blog Harriet will add option to subscribe next year so that caregivers will receive email when there are new posts
 - Sheet to have caregivers write email to subscribe at Open House?
- Board Meetings: difficult time (dinner will help)
- Testimonials for website and Facebook page?
- Snack don't accept junk food, Harriet will make sure appropriate snacks are in both classrooms
