HOPSTOPS

Held in both Hanover and Claremont, NH, children ages 3 and up and their adult companions enjoy free performances designed to entertain and introduce young children to the world of dance, music, theater and storytelling. These performances are participatory, so come ready to sing, dance and clap along—bring the whole family! HopStops are offered throughout the school year, often in conjunction with Visiting Artist performances. HopStops are free and open to the public; no tickets or registration required. - Unless otherwise noted Hanover HopStops (September -May (no December)) are held in Alumni Hall, located on the second floor of the Hopkins Center (signs are posted). Doors open at 10:30 for an 11:00 show. Seating is limited. Hourly parking is available in the Hanover Parking Garage located on Lebanon Street. Metered parking on the street is also available.
- Claremont HopStops (September November, March May) are held at the Claremont Savings Bank
 Community Center at 128 South Street, Claremont. Doors open at 2:30 for a 3:00 show. Seating is limited
 and on a first come first serve basis. Free parking is offered in the lot right next to the Community Center
 or at the middle school across the road.

The next performances will be on September 17th (Uncle Rock – rock and roll music for the young and old) and October 1st (Revels North).

WEEKEND CLEANING SIGN UP/CLASSROOM AIDING & SNACK

If you have not already done so, please sign up for weekend cleaning. Weekend cleaning involves a general tidying of **both classrooms**, including but not limited to thorough vacuuming and mopping the floors. Specific directions are posted in each classroom. This involves around 2 hours of time. We are in need of family aides and/or snack providing on lots of upcoming school days. **Please consider aiding on Outside Fridays – which will happen every Friday beginning September 23rd. YOUR CHILD SHOULD HAVE...

Each day your child should have a good-sized backpack including:

- A filled water bottle,
- A change of clothes in a big Ziploc bag
- Clothing appropriate for current or forecast weather conditions this means an outer layer as the weather cools; a rain coat and mud boots; and snow boots, snow pants, hat and waterproof mittens in the winter. We do plan to go outside each day, rain or shine (except in thunderstorms or extreme cold).

HOMEMADE PLAY DOUGH RECIPE

1 cup flour
½ cup salt
1 cup water
1 Tablespoon oil
1 teaspoon cream of tartar
Food coloring of choice

Cook and stir over moderate heat until mixture forms a ball. When cooked, store in an airtight container or zippered bag.
